

Input OMRI Certificates

Three Important Watch-Outs

- 1 Ensure the OMRI certificate corresponds with product you plan to use and the reason you want to use it by double checking the Product, Company, Category, and Class
- 2 Verify the **Status** and make sure you comply with the restrictions
 - Just because it's OMRI doesn't mean you can use it without restrictions
 - Most nutritional products require documentation on known soil deficiencies prior to use
- 3 Make sure your application date is between the Issue Date and Expiration Date of the certificate

Make sure your Organic System Plan (OSP) – Requested Inputs reflect **ALL** of the products that will be used in advance.

If additional products are needed outside the OSP, approval must be given by the certification agency and your OSP will need to be updated.

Example – OMRI Listed Certificate for Regalia



The following product is OMRI Listed. It may be used in certified organic production or food processing and handling according to the USDA National Organic Program Rule.

Restrictions
May be used as a pest lure, repellent, or as part of a trap, or as a disease control. May be used for other pesticidal purposes if the requirements of 205.206(e) are met, which requires the use of preventative, mechanical, physical, and other pest, weed, and disease management practices.
